## THE PASTOR'S TWO BITS

May is a month of honoring, celebrating, and remembering - Mothers' Day, graduations, school-year achievements, Memorial Day.

On Mother's Day this year, we are beginning a new tradition. We will be receiving a one-day special offering that will go to our Tennessee Baptist Children's Homes. (We will still do the baby bottle campaign between Mother's Day and Fathers' Day for our local Plateau Pregnancy Center, too.) But the Tennessee Baptist Children's Home offering is something that many of our sister churches throughout the state have done for years. It helps maintain three residential campuses that currently serves 42 children, assists numerous foster homes currently housing 85 children, and helps recruit and train new Christian foster parents. The TBCH is also in the process of replacing residential buildings on their campuses to provide safer and healthier environments for children in their care. It is a 133 year old ministry of the Tennessee Baptist Convention that has helped thousands of children in the past and promises to help thousands more in the years to come. (By the way, we will be receiving a similar offering on Father's Day for the Tennessee Baptist Adult Homes. More on that next month.)

This year, we do not have any graduating students in our youth ministry, but we have plenty of school-year achievements to celebrate. Our AWANA awards night is May 8. Dale and LuAnn Klein have done another GREAT JOB at leading our clubs again this year. Many others of you have helped make this another great year for the kids. And the kids... together, they have memorized hundreds of verses and done

workbooks and have brought lots of energy into the church. There have been six AWANA children baptized this year! Come to the awards night and help us celebrate the conclusion of this year's AWANA program.

Memorial Day is an important day in our country. It allows us to pause to remember and express our appreciation for the men and women who served our country. May we not forget the sacrifices that have been made for our freedom.

Remembrances and celebrations are commonplace in the Bible. God prescribed a calendar for the Hebrew people in the Old Testament through which they built in annual feasts and festivals to celebrate and remember. They celebrate Passover, Yom Kippur, Hannukah, Purim, and others. Special offerings were often a part of their celebrations. Each are meant to remind them of God's work among them. In the early church in the New Testament, they celebrated persons being baptized and becoming part of the church. It's good to celebrate and remember. Let's celebrate God this month!

Our generation does not enjoy waiting. We rush through our lives without stopping to evaluate our activities. Part of God's restorative process is to slow us down and make us listen to Him. As we wait on Him, God will remind us of our utter dependence upon His strength. When we slow down and seek His will, He will reveal His plans.

Biblically, waiting on the Lord is never passive; it is always active. Waiting requires us to cease our own pursuits and give God our complete attention. We may have to give up some of the activities we have allowed to inundate our lives. We may need to take an entire day to sit quietly before the Lord. If we ask Him, God will show us the resources He has provided to help with the work we have been attempting on our own. God may address feelings of guilt that have motivated us to do things that He has not asked us to do. Jesus carried more responsibility than you do. More people needed Him than will ever need you. Yet He was never overwhelmed or inadequate for the task. Now Christ offers to guide you so that you will fulfill your heavenly Father's will and gain the strength necessary for each day.







Don't know what 3x3's are all about, see the article below. Get to know your fellow church brothers and sisters better and have a fun time, too.

#### **WHAT'S A 3X3???**

Here's how it works: Once you are assigned to a group, each group decides among themselves which couple will take the lead and host the first meal. The host will provide the meat (main course) and beverages; the second couple in your group will bring a salad and a vegetable; the remaining couple will bring bread and a dessert. The following month, everyone in the group switches responsibilities and a different couple will serve as host and the two remaining couples will bring the rest of the meal. The third month you switch again so that everyone in the group is given the opportunity to be host. To recap, each couple will serve as host for one month, bring salad/vegetable one month, and then dessert/bread one month.

The meal is most often a dinner but it can be a luncheon, brunch, picnic – anything your group decides, you're your own boss. In addition to eating, you can use this time to do other fun things like games, boat rides, biblical discussions, music/singing, or just an evening of conversation. It's a great way to get to know where each other was born, places they've lived and worked, education, missions, families – the kind of things you share when developing friendships.

After three months have passed, you are assigned to a different group of couples and the fun begins all over again. Groups are assigned in March for March, April and May; in June for June, July and August; and finally in September for September, October and November. For the month of December, we have a big Christmas Party with everyone participating together. Each couple will bring either a dessert or an appetizer. Lots of fun and fellowship with very little work for any one couple. Because so many of us like to travel during the winter months, we press the pause button for January and February. Then come March, new groupings begin again.

This fellowship is open to everyone – married couples, dating couples, and even singles. If you are single, just find another single to be the other half of your team. If you're wondering if this type of socializing delivers on its promise, just ask anyone who has participated. We stand by the reputation the 3x3 Dinner Groupings have set. Sound good? Give it a try. Sign up and get to know your church family while having a lot of fun doing it.




