Someone recently asked me where I would like to see the church in 5 years. I quickly replied that I see no reason that this church shouldn't have at least 400 persons in worship every Sunday morning. The fact is that there are plenty of lost and unchurched people moving into Fairfield Glade and Cumberland County every month. We are in a unique position compared to many churches in that we have a continual stream of new residents in our community to reach out to. We commonly have lots of visitors in our worship services. Reach out to them. Invite them to lunch after church or to your Sunday School class next week or to one of our Bible Studies during the week. Love them into our church family. And for those who don't just show up on their own... Let's go get them!

400 people?

Where would we put them? Wouldn't we have to have multiple worship services? ... and Sunday Schools?

Yes.

But aren't we about to vote to just have one worship service and one Sunday School time?

Yes.

???

The morning Jesus was resurrected, Mary Magdalene, expecting to find His dead body in the tomb, mistook Him for a gardener when He first appeared alive to her. Even though it's not the point of the story, I think Jesus would have made a great gardener. He actually told several stories about gardening during His teaching career. He talked about planting seeds and how they grow. He talked about vineyards - some that produced well, and some that didn't. In fact, in John 15:1-2 (NKJV), He said, "*I am the true vine, and My Father is the vinedresser. Every branch in Me that does not bear*

fruit He takes away; and <u>every branch that bears fruit</u> <u>He prunes, that it may bear more fruit</u>."

Pruning is an important part of successful gardening. When a tree or plant or flower is pruned, it can then focus its energy better to grow stronger and fuller. It makes for a healthier plant. Notice that it isn't just the old, unproductive branches that get pruned. It's the good ones; the ones already bearing fruit. ---For the purpose that they will bear even more!

Church schedules and programs should be like that. I believe that in our case, pruning back our worship schedule to one service now can help us focus our energy better to grow stronger and fuller in the future. Then someday, hopefully in the not-so-distant future we might have to vote again to have two worship services not because we want two worship styles; but because our building just isn't big enough for all of us all at once. Wouldn't that be great!

On April 9, we are planning a 'Town Hall' style discussion on the proposal to move to a 'permanent' single-service schedule as we have been doing since December. We will vote on April 14. I have been hearing lots of positive comments about it in the past few months. Our attendance is up 12% in the first three months of this year compared to this time last year. I believe we are already experiencing benefits from the new schedule. At our last Business Meeting, when we approved to hold a vote on this issue, we set a very high standard. The vote needs to be at least 90% positive to pass. That would indicate overwhelming unity, which is part of the purpose of having only one service in the first place. Wouldn't it be even better to have 100%! Let's make this a prayerful decision. Let's let God tend His garden. Let Him plant. Let Him tend His vineyard. Let Him prune. -That it (we) may bear more fruit. - So that someday, we will have to vote again to have two services... again!

Justification, Forgiveness, and Imputation!

It was to show his righteousness at the present time, so that he might be just and the

justifier of the one who has faith in Jesus. Romans 3:26 [NASB]

Justification is to be pronounced righteous. It is the legal and judicial act where God declares the believer righteous in Jesus Christ. It is not only the removal of the believer's guilt but also the imputation of Christ's righteousness in its place. Believers are not righteous in themselves, but only in Christ. There are two halves of justification. The first half is concerning the forgiveness, remission, and removal of the believer's sin. Within this facet of justification, God is just in declaring that the payment for sin is reckoned by the believer's faith in the redeeming work of Jesus Christ on the cross. This half's main thought is that there is a subtraction of penalty. However, the second half is concerning God imparting Christ's righteousness onto the believer by exercising His diving grace toward the believer. This half's main thought is that there is an addition of grace.

God is just in performing both aspects concealed in this great doctrine. Because of Jesus Christ's redeeming work on the cross, He cancelled the debt of sin and opened up the floodgate of God's rich grace and mercy to be poured on those in Christ. The Apostle Paul explains this truth where he writes, "But now the righteousness of God without the law is manifested, being witnessed by the law and the prophets; even the righteousness of God which is by faith of Jesus Christ unto all and upon all them that believe: for there is no difference: for all have sinned, and come short of the glory of God; being justified freely by his grace through the redemption that is in Christ Jesus: whom God hath set forth to be a propitiation through faith in his blood, to declare his righteousness for the remission of sins that are past, through the forbearance of God; to declare, I say, at this time his righteousness: that he might be just, and the justifier of him which believeth in Jesus." (Rom. 3:21-26).

From these verses the facets of the doctrine of justification become clear. It is the righteousness of God that is imputed upon those of faith. It is God's grace that is freely given, that is, without cause, upon him who believes. And, it is Christ's shed blood and death which is the only acceptable payment for sins. Because of these facets, the results of justification on the believer is that he is a new man (2 Cor. 5:17-18), he is made the righteousness of God (2 Cor. 5:21; Phil. 3:7-9), he is perfected forever, in position, not in daily life, and set apart (Heb. 10-14), and he has the fullness of Christ being baptized into Christ's family (1 Cor. 12:13).

Let us be ever grateful for Jesus' sinless life; for His death burial, and resurrection; and for His love, grace, forgiveness, and mercy that are so freely lavished upon us! - Pastor Elliot
