Many of you know that I recently did a backpacking trip in Colorado. What you might not know is that, somewhere in the Indian Peaks Wilderness Area, somewhere between 11,000 and 12,000 feet in elevation, I lost my wedding ring! It was too new and shiny. We liked my 40-year-old, dingy one a lot better.

When I got home from the trip, I unpacked all my gear to clean it and air it out. After a few days, I got it all put away and the trip was over. I had my shiny new ring that reminded me of my loss. A few days after receiving my new ring, Kay Lynn and I were straightening up around the house after our grandson's visit. Kay Lynn noticed something where I had aired out my sleeping bag. It was my old wedding ring! It must have slipped off my finger on that third morning of the hike when I packed up my gear! We were so surprised! I tend to think that God got a chuckle about knowing how happy we were going to be when we found it! It's really sad to lose something; but it's really nice to find what was lost...
