Merry Christmas! I pray that you will have a wonderful Christmas season. May it be filled with all that Jesus wants to bring into your life. This year during the weeks leading up to Christmas, I will be bringing messages about the gifts that the wise men brought to Jesus. Ans as we've done in past years, we will celebrate the season by lighting advent candles each week.

The first is the week of **Hope**. We live in a fallen world. When Adam and Eve committed the first sin, a barrier was formed between us and God. Ever since, God made ways to help us (people) come back to Him. In the Old Testament, it was all the sacrifices in the Temple. But in our New Testament times, God sent Jesus to become our sacrifice. JOY (part 1) - The Joy of Christmas

For to us a child is born, to us a son is given; and the government shall be upon his shoulder, and his name shall be called Wonderful Counselor, Mighty God, Everlasting Father, Prince of Peace. Of the increase of his government and of peace there will be no end, on the throne of David and over his kingdom, to establish it and to uphold it with justice and with righteousness from this time forth and forevermore. The zeal of the Lord of hosts will do this. Isaiah 9:6-7 [ESV]

There are three aspects of joy that we would like to consider this most excellent holiday season: the joy of Christmas, the joy of Christ, and the joy of Christians. First, we are introduced to the joy of Christmas by Dr. Luke's description of what happened that first Christmas night: "And in the same region there were shepherds out in the field, keeping watch over their flock by night. And an angel of the Lord appeared to them, and the glory of the Lord shone around them, and they were filled with great fear. And the angel said to them, "Fear not, for behold, I bring you good news of great joy that will be for all the people. For unto you is born this day in the city of David a Savior, who is Christ the Lord." (Luke 2:8-11). The joy of Christmas must begin with the birth of Jesus Christ. However, the "joy" the angel referred to all those years ago in his announcement encompassed not just the birth of Jesus, but also His life, His death, and the overall results of Jesus' coming, that is, humankind's reconciliation with the Holy God. You see, Jesus had come unannounced to earth many times before, though not as a man, but as the pre-incarnate Christ, full of all deity and authority. Jesus spoke with Abraham, Jacob, Gideon, and many others. His visits then were for a specific purpose; in a specific time; and for a specific person. This time, however, was different. This time, Jesus chose to not employ any of His Godly authority, but chose to be born of a virgin and chose to submit to His Heavenly Father for every aspect of life in His mortal body. For the first time in all eternity Jesus would get hungry, require sleep to maintain good health, and be affected by the heat of the sun and the cool of the night. For the first time, Jesus Christ would experience death and the turning away of His Father's attention. But, for the moment, an innocent baby boy was born to a virgin girl, a supernatural miracle, and the hope of all those who had waited for this blessed day was finally realized. Hope came and was given a name: Jesus. And the arrival of the Christ child was exactly as the angel announced: good news of great joy!

Let's remember the real reason for the season, our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ! -Pastor Elliot


