THE PASTOR'S TWO BITS

Happy New Year! May God bless you in 2024! And may God bless Fairfield Glade First Baptist Church. When stepping into a new year, I usually like to look back and evaluate the old year; and look forward to set goals for the new.

I am rating 2023 as an 'okay' year for FG FBC.

- Our attendance stabilized from the downturn of the past couple of years. We even saw an increase of about 12% in the second half of the year. We had 28 new members including six by baptism!
- We brought Barry and Elliot on staff (and they've done GREAT!)
- We began the CARE ministry that has already helped meet numerous needs within the congregation.
- We had good revival services in October. It seems that the spirit of the church was... revived. By the way, we've already invited Monty Bounds back for 2024!
- Our Fellowship and Adult leadership teams did a great job planning events to bring us together.
- Although our budget giving has been low, the Building
 Fund giving was very strong. At the time of this writing,
 we are nearing our goal of being debt free. I hope that by
 the time you are reading this, we will be!

I am giving 2023 an 'okay' rating because although we had victories to celebrate, I believe there are some areas that are still waiting to be developed to their full potential.

I hope that 2024 will be a year of **outreach and evangelism**. God stirred a small group in this past year to begin visiting new people in the Glade, but we still have not gained steady and consistent traction with it. Studies show that new church plants far outpace older, existing churches in baptisms and numerical growth. The primary reason is that new churches are excited about 'advertising' themselves to their communities and sharing Jesus more freely. Older churches get complacent about those things. We've gotten complacent about them. My prayer is that we will find the enthusiasm in 2024 to reach into FFG and Cumberland County with the Gospel and with face-to-face invitations to our church.

Neither has there been enthusiasm about **missions**. I am grateful that we voted to increase our Cooperative program to 9.75% to get us ever closer to our 10% goal and I am grateful

that we generously support Lottie Moon, Annie Armstrong, and Golden offerings for missions. But my hope is that we will develop a heart for hands-on, boots-on-the-ground missions efforts. We have opportunities through our IMB, NAMB, and TBMB partners. We could come alongside a church in the Blue Oval city area to help them reach the thousands of new people who will move there for jobs. We could join mission efforts elsewhere in the U.S. through Send Relief. We could train and be ready to go with Disaster Relief. We have international missionaries to support... The list could go on and on. We don't have to try to do it all, but I pray that we would choose something to sink our teeth into that is beyond our 'normal' ministry area.

I also hope that we will find a **unified comfort zone for worship.** We took a survey last June about whether to move to a one-service Sunday morning format. Although the survey showed 75-80% positive feedback, there were about 20% who indicated they might seek a different church should we make such a change. Various reasons were given for that. Since then, our staff has been praying about the matter and researching ways to address some of the concerns voiced through the surveys. I believe we have some solutions. During at least January and February, through our typical winter downturn in attendance, we are going to move to the one-service format. The schedule will be:

9:00 a.m. Sunday School for everyone 10:30 a.m. Combined Worship Service (including Children's Church)

If this format proves acceptable and unifying, then we can bring it to the church for whether to make it permanent. It will be a test whether we can set aside personal preferences and really seek God's will in what is best for the church as a whole. I pray that 2024 will be a year of a new unified spirit in our church family.

These are just a few of the goals I have for the church in 2024. What is our potential? How can we develop it into reality? ...May God be glorified through FG FBC this year!

Joy (part 2) - The Joy of Christ

But we see him who for a little while was made lower than the angels, namely Jesus, crowned with glory and honor because of the suffering of death, so that by the grace of God he might taste death for everyone. Hebrews 2:9 [ESV]


Jesus grew and became strong; He was filled with wisdom, and the grace of God was on Him. Jesus often spoke of joy. He told stories hoping to relate joy to human experiences so that we might understand. He told of a shepherd who was in charge of a hundred sheep. Learning that one was lost, the shepherd left the ninety-nine to find it. When he finally found it, he put the sheep on his shoulders, rejoicing as he returned to the fold. Jesus also told of a woman who had lost one of her silver coins. Frantically, she swept and searched diligently for it. After finding it she rejoiced with her friends. Jesus told a third story about a man with two sons. One son, taking his share of the inheritance his father was to leave him, squandered the wealth and then returned to his father apologetically. The father, however, seeing his son a long way off, felt compassion for him, ran to him, embraced him, and kissed him! After telling these stories, Jesus went on to tell His listeners that there is more rejoicing in Heaven when one sinner repents! Hebrews 11 tells about many in the faith who have gone before us in death. Many of these heroes were tortured for their faith and unswerving commitment to their God. Then, the writer of Hebrews begins the next chapter with these two verses: "Therefore, since we are surrounded by so great a cloud of witnesses, let us also lay aside every weight, and sin which clings so closely, and let us run with endurance the race that is set before us, looking to Jesus, the founder and perfecter of our faith, who for the joy that was set before him endured the cross, despising the shame, and is seated at the right hand of the throne of God."

Who for the joy that was set before him endured the cross!?!" How could there be any joy in the suffering caused by the betrayal of his friends? How could there be any joy in the suffering caused by the mocking, false testimonies, and beatings of the religious leaders? How could there be any joy in the suffering caused by the beating of his body, the whippings to his back and front-side, the nails being driven through His hands and feet, the crown of thorns being forced on His head, the spear being thrust into His side, and, finally, death through suffocation? How can there be any joy? There would be joy because Jesus knew that once this temporary suffering was done a new life could finally be offered to all mankind. There would be joy because Jesus knew that His father would find His sacrifice acceptable. There would be joy because Jesus knew that death would once and for all time be defeated. There would be joy because Jesus knew that all people would be given the chance of reconciliation with Him and His father. There would be joy because Jesus knew that His work on the cross would restore the fellowship between God and man, the way the fellowship was intended to be before the first sin. There would be joy because Jesus knew He would be exalted as King of kings and Lord of lords. There would be joy because Jesus knew he would be returning to His father to claim His rightful place at His father's side. You see, Jesus was looking beyond the cross to the joy in which He was about to enter. This was the joy of Christ, and He makes that joy available to those who place their trust in Him!

Let's revel in the joy bestowed upon us through the giving of the Christ Child and the eventual payment for our sins, not to mention all the other gifts lavished on us by our Heavenly Father through Christ Jesus our Lord!






