# THE PASTOR'S TWO BITS

What were they thinking? People do strange things when they are grieving. Some are like robots, just going through the motions of life. Some get fixated on doing a particular task whether it needs done or not; and they might not think ahead or organize themselves to get it done right, if they are able to get it done at all. In times of grief, sometimes we just don't think well. But...

What were they thinking?

On the Sunday morning after the Sabbath Day after the day Jesus was crucified a group of women started off to the tomb to properly care for His body - to prepare it for its final burial. They had the traditional burial spices. They likely had some water and rags to wash him. They were running on empty; likely hadn't slept for three days. The last time they saw the body it was beaten and swollen nearly beyond recognition. They were going about their busy business, knowing that somebody needed to do what needed to be done, but... what were they thinking?

They knew that there were armed guards at the tomb and a rock in front of it so big that it would take several men and very likely some ropes and pry bars to roll it away. They had good intentions, but their mission was doomed to failure before they even started. What were they thinking?

Grief and hopelessness cause us to think less clearly than usual.

I don't think that they were thinking anything about resurrection. I don't think that they were hoping for anything more than honoring their loved one with a proper burial. But...

**JESUS IS ALIVE!**

It doesn't appear that those women planned very well for finishing what they set out to do. Getting access to the body would be the biggest challenge in the whole process. But when they arrived at the tomb, the stone was already rolled aside, the body was gone, the guards were terrified, and there was an angel waiting for them:

*Do not be afraid; for I know that you seek Jesus who was crucified. He is not here; for He is risen, as He said. Come, see the place where He lay.*

I don't think they ever thought that they were about to be the first persons ever to hear the Good News of the resurrection! They never thought they would talk to an angel that morning! And they never thought that their burial spices were going to go to waste! They never thought that they would be the first persons ever to be charged with the Great Commission: "**GO QUICKLY AND TELL...**"

**JESUS IS ALIVE!**

We celebrate Easter for one reason and one reason only. Jesus is our Savior and Lord. I hope that's the reason you have for celebration!

Jay and I met over the decision of which verses to use that would be meaningful to folks who have lost a loved one.


Jay requested quotations on signs but the project just did not get finished while he was still here. He also made donations to the Columbarium fund to pay for this project.

Jim Botbyl worked with me on the stone slabs and arranged for them to be donated by Silvara Stone. He also helped find the folks who poured the foundations and transported them to the church, along with locating the engraver who did a fabulous job plus helped setting them in their final locations.

So there were several people involved that made this project happen but it was Jay's vision that started it all.

## ***A Recent Encounter With God***

***Make your ways known to me, Lord, Teach me your paths. Psalm 25:4 [CSV]***

I recently attended the Church Revitalization Conference in Mt. Juliet that was assembled by the Tennessee Baptist Mission Board (TBMB). It was a time of worship, learning, and, quite frankly, renewal. Revitalization is the act to revitalize, “to give new vitality or vigor to” and is a compound of the prefix re- “again, back” and the verb vitalize “to give life to.” Vitalize, in turn, is formed from vital “of or relating to life” and the verbal suffix -ize. So, to play the role of “Captain Obvious”, spiritual revitalization is the process in which we purposely take steps to gain health, hardiness, strength, and stamina in our spiritual selves.

Expecting to learn various methods that I might bring back to our church, I was surprised that the first speaker failed to dive into the various methods and techniques church leaders can employ to help their churches grow in vitality. Instead, Dr. Bill Elliff spoke to us concerning being in God’s presence. With the topics Dr. Elliff spoke on and the worship times provided, there was a moving in my spirit... a drawing of the Holy Spirit on my heart to enter more fully into His presence, visualizing myself kneeling and bowing before our Great God at His throne, with King Jesus sitting at His right hand. It was a sobering and disarming time.

In Dr. Elliff’s book, **The Presence Centered Church** he writes, “*Sadly, something is missing in the church. For all our good intentions, each year thousands of churches close their doors (most studies say over 6,000 a year). Hundreds of pastors leave the ministry every month, and more than 75 percent of American churches are not growing. Although there are many wonderful, vibrant churches, our nation’s moral and spiritual condition shows the effects of a weakened church. We are having little effect on society and society is having a massive effect on us. We have crossed the tipping point. No political manipulation can bring our nation back from the spiritual wasteland we are entering. We need God. We need Him deeply and desperately. And we need Him now. Without a divine invasion of His manifest presence, every life, every local church, and the church in our nation is doomed to meager impact and overall decline. Let us make it the goal of our lives and ministries to do everything God directs to discover His presence: in our lives, our churches, and our nation.*” (page 21)

I did learn some helpful methods, techniques, and priorities that can help in our efforts of revitalization. More to come on that in the future. But it was thrilling, and sobering, to first start the conference by entering, purposefully, into the presence of the Almighty.

**It is my continued prayer that all of us at Fairfield Glade First Baptist Church would seek the presence of our Heavenly Father and move forward at His command!**
