THE PASTOR'S TWO BITS

I don't know the origins of this, but after my last sermon series about 'the church', someone gave me an old article that they tucked away years ago.

10 RULES FOR IMPROVING THE CHURCH

- 1. Tell yourself over and over that since you are not perfect, you would not fit into a perfect congregation if one existed.
- 2. Instead of picking out 'the worldly member' to point to, pick out sincere, dedicated, spiritual members and thank God for them. You will find what you seek.
- 3. If you are old, treat the young with the consideration that you desired as a young person. If you are young, treat older adults with the respect you want when you mature.
- 4. When you are tempted to criticize others, be sure to pray earnestly for them first. This may not change them, but it will do wonders for your attitude.
- 5. When you see work neglected, instead of being critical, offer to help.
- 6. Never blame others for your failures. Everyone can be fruitful in spite of bad examples and discouraging attitudes of others, if they are determined to be.
- 7. Consciously look for the good qualities in every brother and sister in Christ. When you think of a brother or sister, make a mental note of the good points each possesses.
- 8. Remind yourself every day that the only way you can improve the world or the church is to begin with self.
- 9. Constantly strive to increase your circle of associates in the church. Try to do something good for each one.
- 10. Every church has problems. Constantly ask yourself, "Am I part of the problem or part of the solution?"

There's some real wisdom in there. During our recent revival services we were challenged to be part of the solution to making this church a beacon to our community. But we can't do it 'out there' if we don't get it right 'in here'. Did you know that one of the greatest criticisms from unchurched persons about the church is how church people treat people, both, inside and outside the church? They detect hypocrisy between our words and our actions.

FG FBC isn't perfect because none of us is perfect and since the church is the people and not the building, then the church isn't perfect. But we need to do everything we can to eliminate hypocrisy and the perception of hypocrisy from among us. Our attitudes toward one another should reflect the love of Christ in all situations. Ephesians 4:32

says, "And be ye kind one to another, tenderhearted, forgiving one another, even as God for Christ's sake has forgiven you."

I believe that our revival services went a long way to doing what they were intended to do – to reignite us to be the church that God wants us to be. Take another look at the 10 'Rules' above. Be honest with yourself and with God. What can you do to help improve the church?



How One is Saved

For by grace are ye saved through faith; and that not of yourselves: it is the gift of God: Not of works, lest any man should boast. Ephesians 2:8-9 [KJV]

Biblical salvation is one of the most beautiful pictures of the Heavenly Father's enormous love for humankind. Man chose to rebel against God and put his relationship with the Almighty in jeopardy. The result of this rebellion was that sin entered God's perfect world. The God-head, in eternity past, put a plan of redemption together, waiting to reveal it. In Jesus Christ, God's plan of salvation was manifested for all the ages to recognize. Finally, humankind could enjoy the relationship that Jehovah had intended.

God's grace is the primary force that makes salvation possible. God pours out His infinite supply of grace because Jesus fulfilled His mission on earth. Jesus Christ lived a perfect life, and died a perfect death, all the while being totally surrendered to His Father. It was by God's grace that Jesus should taste death for every man (Heb. 2:9). God did not pour out His grace with any regard to humankind. All have sinned and fall short of God's holy requirements (Rom. 3:10-11, 23). Mankind rebels against God, curses God, denies and neglects God. As such, mankind does not possess the strength to meet God's requirements for dwelling with the Holy God (Rom. 5:6). In fact, all of humankind - all of us, are (or have been) an enemy of God (Rom. 5:10).

Though God's grace is the primary force of salvation, faith needs to be present for the gift of grace to be transferred to the recipient. God's grace has appeared to all men (Titus 2:11), but not all men are partakers of God's generous benevolence. "For whosoever believeth...", "For whosoever shall call...", and "...shalt confess with thy mouth... and shalt believe in thine heart..." are just a few phrases in God's Word that indicate man's response to God's gift. God exposes His gift of grace. A person, in turn, rejects it or receives it. This process does not happen any other way. The belief a person must have, and that God accepts, is the belief in His Son. That Jesus is exactly Who He says He is and that God has raised Him from the dead. The apostle Paul writes, "And if Christ be not risen, then is our preaching vain, and your faith is also vain." (1 Cor. 15:14); and "But now is Christ risen from the dead, and become the first fruits of them that slept." (1 Cor. 15:20), and "...even so in Christ shall all be made alive." (1 Cor. 15:22). When a person honors God's Son by believing in Him, God takes the death of Jesus Christ and applies it to that person. It is that person's faith that causes God to look upon them as having been in Christ when He died. It is that person's faith that causes God to credit them with salvation.

So, what can a person do to 'help' God's save them? The short answer is 'NOTHING'! Man is powerless to invoke God's grace. God's grace is not merited or earned. There is nothing a person can do that would cause God to owe them anything. Because man's sin strikes at the very heart of God's love, we must humbly throw ourselves at the feet of God's mercy, in repentance, to invoke His grace. He does this through faith.

Let's celebrate this Thanksgiving season with hearts overflowing with thankfulness


